Why Does Attendance Matter?

As a parent/carers you want the best for your children. Having a good education is an important factor in opening up more opportunities in adult life. Did you know...

- a child who is absent a day of school per week misses an equivalent of two years of their school life
- 90% of young people with absence rates below 85% fail to achieve five or more good grades of GCSE and around one third achieve no GCSEs at all
- poor examination results limit young people's options and poor attendance suggests to colleges and employers that these students are unreliable
- poor school attendance is also closely associated with crime a quarter of school age offenders have truanted repeatedly
- at least 1 million children take at least one half day off a year without permission
- 7.5 million School days are missed each year through unauthorised absence.

Students - In year 5 or 6 in September? Join Culture Club after school and you can enjoy a range of activities, workshops, guided tours and tips to explore Island culture through art and photography. Over 12 weeks you will create your own art - this can be anything from craft, drawing, pottery, photography, video or painting - whatever your experience, interests or your free exploring culture at our workshops suggests. No show of your skills or try to new technique to show what you've made, explored and enjoyed. All you have to do is submit your work and your thoughts in our Explore entry log as you go along and take part in the Club exhibition in December.

Parents - The weekly 1hr after-school club starts on 5th Sept this and aims to support children to try out cultural activities whilst gaining an Arts Award Explore (entry level qualification). Offered twice weekly to provide cultural opportunities for children to enhance their creativity and support PSHE development. Funded by Arts Council England through the Island's LIFT the Laid partnership, the club involves a minimal cost of £12 per pupil, with moderation and certification costs provided for. Teachers CIC use the Island's social enterprise for cultural heritage, bringing the Island's rich culture to life for our schools since 2014.
