## This term's Topic - USA

#### Homework

As your child is now entering Upper Key Stage Two, their homework commitments and expectations will alter to reflect their growing maturity. The <u>weekly homework timetable</u> for Year 5 is as follows:

English - set on Monday - to be handed in on Thursday Numeracy - set on Thursday - to be handed in on Monday Topic - set and handed in as instructed by Mrs. Blackley

Topic homework will consist of a topic grid which will have a variety of tasks related to the topic; children will choose three tasks they would like to complete. The work should be done on A4 paper. Tasks are handed in as they are completed, with all three to be handed in by the last week of the half term. This is expected to be completed independently, although some guidance may be needed.

Children are also expected to read their school book or other media on a daily basis. Other homework may be handed out from time to time. Homework will also involve learning spellings and times tables.

As ever, with all homework, your support would be greatly appreciated as discussion and practise will help improve confidence.
