### LITERACY

To listen and join in with stories and poems. Develop a love of reading and interest in books as sources of information/enjoyment. Answer and ask questions about what is read.

Applying phonics by developing skills of segmenting (for spelling CVC words) and blending (for reading). To recognise some tricky words from sight and own name.

To recognise the initial sounds in words.

#### MATHS

Investigating numbers to 8. Understanding the value, order and meaning behind the digit. Where do we see these numbers in real life? How are they used? How are values represented in different ways?

Subitising number.

Exploring shapes around us.

Understanding and celebrating the uniqueness of each other. Respecting difference

Sharing news of family traditions and customs.

#### EXPRESSIVE ARTS AND Design

Exploring music, dance and instruments - linked to Chinese New Year.
