Club News

Our new clubs map will be sent out by 23rd March. However we would just like to let you know about one of the new clubs, Relax Kids. Relax Kids will be run by Mrs. Gerty (from Shalfleet).

A Relax Kids class includes warm up and movement, fun drama-based games, relaxing mindfulness games, stretching and breathing exercises, massage, affirmations and visualizations. Mrs. Gerty will take children from a high energy to a low energy and encourage them to relax whilst developing their creativity and imagination. Sessions support children's mental and emotional well-being and give them tools to manage stress and be more resilient, calm and confident. Classes are fun, lively, creative and most importantly - relaxing.

Classes will be £15 for the six week sessions to be paid when booking.

Clubs/Trips

As you are all aware the financial pressure on schools is increasing year upon year. With this in mind we would like to explain a few new procedures, to ensure we are able to provide children with the best possible opportunities.

Clubs

We provide a varied, interesting and cost effective club program. We are now only accepting club applications with full payment. It is worth being mindful that even clubs run by a member of staff incur costs to the school.

Trips

When we arrange a school trip we do try to keep the cost down. The payment requested from parents is advertised as 'voluntary contribution' (we also supplement those pupils in receipt of pupil premium with a 50% reduction) However, if a number of parents decide not to make a 'voluntary contribution' quite rightly the trip cost is not covered, we may need to cancel the trip.

If finding that 'extra' for school trips is causing you a problem, please do pop into the office and make an appointment to see a senior member of staff to discuss.

Please be assured that we do not 'make' money from clubs or trips. To keep the cost down we price our clubs and trips at cost which does not leave any 'pennies to cover nonpayment.

We would also like to thank our PTFA for their contributions towards our trips.

Pupil Premium

Did you know that successful applications for Pupil Premium provides the school with an extra £1320! This money can then be used to help you with the additional costs of trips and clubs. For your convenience we have included in this newsletter the new application forms. GDPR - Data Protection
What is GDPR?
Things are changing!

The GDPR will apply in all EU member states from 25 May 2018. This will affect how schools manage personal data and how this is protected and shared.

The EU's **General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)** is the result of four years of work by the EU to bring data protection legislation into line with new, previously unforeseen ways that data is now used.

Currently, the UK relies on the Data Protection Act 1998, which was enacted following the 1995 EU Data Protection Directive, but this will be superseded by the new legislation. It introduces tougher fines for non-compliance and breaches, and gives people more say over what companies can do with their data. It also makes data protection rules more or less identical throughout the EU.

In the coming weeks we will be updating Privacy Notices, policies and Consent Forms to make sure we are compliant with the new GDPR.

APPLICATION FOR PUPIL PREMIUM

Dear Parent/Guardian,

We want to make sure that we are providing your child with the best education and support we can. Healthy school food has obvious health benefits and can help pupils establish healthy habits for life. Healthy school food can also help to improve pupils' readiness to learn.

Families who receive certain benefits may be eligible for free school meals. Your child is eligible for free school meals if you're in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400.
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190

Registering for free meals could also raise an extra **£1,320** for your child's primary school/ **£900** for your child's secondary school], to fund valuable support like extra tuition, additional teaching staff or after school activities.

This additional money is available from central government for every child whose parent is receiving one of the benefits listed above.
