On our trip to Osborne House a house keeper named Mrs Pilkington told us to do chores in a room. Boys had to wear a green apron and cuffs. They had to walk into the room with their hands behind their back. Girls had to wear a white apron and cuffs. They had to hold their hands in front of them.

There were 6 things we needed to do altogether. Here are 3 of them that I did.

First there was polishing the pots - we needed to wear gloves, then pour the polish in the bowl and then start polishing.

Next we polished the shoes. We had to wear gloves and get two brushes. We dipped the brush in the polish and scrubbed hard.

Our third chore was to make the bed. We put a trimmed sheet over it and then a thicker sheet. We put a fluffy quilt over and then put a pillow on.

Will Cool

On our trip to Osborne House a house keeper named Mrs Pilkington told us to do chore sin a room. The boys wore green aprons and girls wore white aprons, we all wore cuffs around our wrists. We did six things and I did fire rings, grinding and laying the table.

When we made fire rings we put on some gloves, folded the corner of the newspaper and carried on folding until it was a strip of paper. Then we tied it so it was in a ring. After we put them in a basket.

Next I did the grinding. We put a sugar lump in a goblet, crushed it and put it in a bowl. After that we mixed two types of tea together in a bowl. Then we put coffee beans into a grinder and ground them until it wouldn't grind anymore.

Lastly, I lay the table, first I got a big plate to the right of us and a small plate on the left of me. Then we folded a napkin and put it on the small plate. Last we set out the cutlery.
