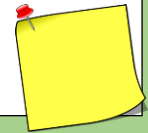

Universal Free School Meals

Please remember all Reception and KS1 pupils are entitled to a free hot meal. Registering for free meals could raise an extra £1,320 (Primary School) or £900 (Secondary School) to fund valuable support like extra tuition, additional teaching staff or after school activities. This additional money is available from central government for every child whose parent is receiving one of the qualifying benefits listed on this form. It is therefore important to sign up for free school meals, even if your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2, so that your child's school receives as much funding as possible

Tucasi Announcement

Dear Parents

I'm sure you'll already be aware that we have partnered with Tucasi's SCOPAY product to manage online payments to our school. Many of you will already have a SCOPAY account.

The exciting news is that SCOPAY is changing to make it even easier to use - over the coming weeks you'll notice that the www.scopay.com website has a new look and feel and will become mobile responsive.

For those of you who prefer the convenience of an App, then a new SCOPAY App is now available for both iOS and Android users - just search SCOPAY from either the App Store or Google Play Store.

If you are not yet registered for SCOPAY then we'd like to encourage you to create an account as this gives you access to a heap of information such as balance information, trip details, receipt history and so much more. You'll also have the ability to configure alerts to remind you if your balance is getting low, when a trip date is due or when a parents evening appointment is getting close...and of course you'll also have the ability to make payments anywhere, anytime, using a credit or debit card.

If you are new to SCOPAY, you'll require a link code to set up your account - just contact the school office and we'll be happy to assist.
