The sports coach has been involved with all classes within the school and his skills have ensured the quality of teaching within lesson has improved throughout all age groups. The sports coach has also focused on children with SEN, Children lacking in confidence within the classroom and children that are more suited to outdoor learning. It has been noted by teachers that once children have returned from sessions with the sports coach they are more focused and eager to learn. Behaviourally at lunch times the amount of behaviour insitences has reduced due to structured sessions being organised by the sports coach in which the children can join as and when they please. Participation within afterschool has gone up from 35 children to 54 children throughout the year, predominantly down to the amount of extra clubs we have been able to offer as a result of having a sports coach.
