To increase the engagement of all pupils within regular physical activity to meet the Chief Medical Officers recommendation of 30 minutes of physical activity within the school day.

To broaden the sporting opportunities available to pupils outside of the school day.

To raise the profile of PE and sport throughout the school day.

To develop confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in the teaching of PE and Sport to ensure sustainability and consistency within the PE Provision we offer.

To ensure all children are given the opportunity to participate within a broader experience of physical activities.

To raise the attainment within swimming and ensure all children are aware of the dangers surrounding water.

## How the decision to best spend the premium was made

At Yarmouth the governing body and leadership team recognise the value of PE and school sport on promoting healthy lifestyles and the benefits to pupil's wider achievement in school. They are committed to sustaining the levels of provision that have been developed over the last four years. This will be achieved with the commitment to continue employing a specialist sports coach to work with children across the school and to support the CPD of teachers so that they remain up-skilled thus creating a sustainable and prosperous ethos surrounding Physical Activity and Sport across our School.
