

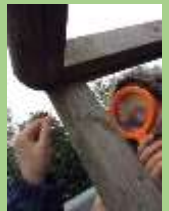
# Outdoor Learning – 3<sup>rd</sup> October 2022

## Web Weavers #2

Things we have learnt this week:

1. It is almost impossible to take a photo of a spider's web!

Trust us – these are photos of orb, sheet, cob and woolly webs!



We couldn't find a funnel web.

2. Webs work in different ways to catch their prey. Orb webs catch unsuspecting insects flying by. Sheet webs catch invertebrates that drop into them. Cob and woolly webs in nooks and crannies trap crawlers and flies looking for food and shelter. Funnel web spiders lurk inside until a vibration triggers them to react! Can you work out which ones we have recreated?

3. Knots keep ropes in place and secure enough to support weight. We're getting pretty good at reef knots and clove hitches.



4. It is important to coil and secure ropes when you store them so they don't get in a tangle.



5. If you raise the starting end of your marble run, the ball will travel faster and further.
