Why high attendance is important for education

As a parent/carer you want the best for your children. Having a good education is an important factor in opening up more opportunities in adult life. Did you know that:

- a child who is absent a day of school per week misses an equivalent of two years of their school life
- 90% of young people with absence rates below 85% fail to achieve five or more good grades of GCSE and around one third achieve no GCSEs at all
- poor examination results limit young people's options and poor attendance suggests to colleges and employers that these students are unreliable

All absence at any stage leads to gaps in your child's learning. This in turn can:

- mean that they fall behind in work
- affect their motivation
- affect their enjoyment of learning
- lead to poor behaviour
- affect their ability to have or keep friendships.

Supporting your child's school attendance

Good school attendance habits are best started early. Children learn from those around them and you as parents/carers set the standards and expectations for your child.

RAISE Training for Isle of Wight Schools

Information for Parents/Carers of Autistic Children & Young

What is RAISE?

RAISE stands for:

Respecting Autistic Identity in Schools & Education

It is part of a nationwide project that aims to reduce the numbers of exclusions, suspensions and hospital admissions of autistic children and young people.

AIM is an Island based autistic led charity that have been commissioned to provide training to several Island schools. This means schools will be trained by Actually Autistic adults who understand what these children and young people may be experiencing.

The goal is to promote **positive autistic identity**, increase **understanding** of autism
and the related **reasonable adjustments**that support autistic students' **mental health**,
and break down the **barriers to attendance**.

What Will the Training Cover?

- Session 1: Introduction & Anxiety
- Session 2: Communication
- Session 3: Sensory Processing
- Session 4: Transitions
- Session 5: Behaviour
- Session 6: Reasonable Adjustments

All sessions are on Fridays - 09:30-13:30

There are 3 runs of the training available between April 2023 and December 2023

Parents & Carers

Spaces are also available for parents/carers of autistic children and young people.

Parents will need to attend all 6 sessions.

If you would like a space on RAISE, please ask your child or young person's school.

What else is RAISE Offering?

School governors and senior leaders will be attending 2 separate sessions so, those able to make changes to school policies receive the necessary information.

Youth Trust's autism specialist will be providing mental health support for autistic children and young people in schools.

Autism Outreach will be assisting schools to review their policies to ensure they include Reasonable Adjustments.

Parents' Voice IOW will be holding forums within each school to facilitate communication between school staff and parents.

AIM will be running a series of workshops for autistic children and young people that focus on manging anxiety and positive autistic identity.

A series of **SEN Law leaflets** to inform parents/carers of their child or young person's **rights** under the **Equality Act**.
