Mrs Thompson is Shalfleet's Duty Lead and Mr Cook is the Duty Lead at Freshwater & Yarmouth.

We are very excited about the new year, the teams across the Federation and the skills set we have secured. We would be very pleased if you would like to meet new or existing members of staff-and would like to invite you to a Meet and Greet session after school on the 12th of September from 3.30pm - 5.00pm. Year 6 children are able to walk home independently provided written permission has been received.
