Dear Parents, welcome back to an exciting new term.

P.E. / Games and Outdoor Learning

In Comet Class, we have P.E. on **Wednesdays** and **Fridays**. Children are asked to come to school wearing the correct clothing on these days; they will also be responsible for removing jewellery and keeping it safe during P.E. lessons. For the first half term the class will have dance lessons on **Mondays** too, so can they please wear PE kits on **Mondays**, **Wednesdays** and **Fridays** for Autumn 1.

Forest Schools activities will be on **Mondays** – clothing needs to be brought in for children to change into.

Homework

As your child enters Year 4, their homework commitments and expectations will alter to reflect their growing maturity. The weekly homework timetable for Year 4 is as follows:

English -set on **Mondays** – to be handed in by **Thursdays**Maths – set on **Thursdays** – to be handed in by **Mondays**Topic – at least one topic task needs to be completed

Topic homework will consist of a topic grid which will have a variety of tasks related to the topic; children can choose any task. The work should be completed on A4 paper. They hand in the tasks once they are complete; they are expected to be completed independently, although some guidance may be needed.

Children are expected to read their school book or other media at least three times a week. Homework will also involve learning their spellings and spelling rules.

As with all homework, your support would be greatly appreciated as discussion and practise will help improve confidence.
