

Mrs Haisell recommends...

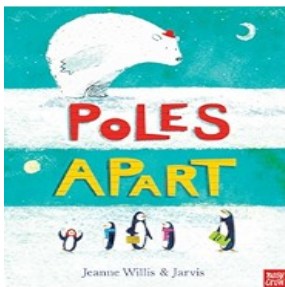

Mrs Munn recommends...



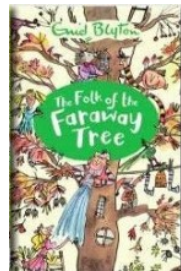
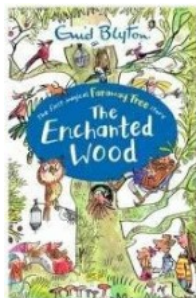
In this book the penguin family from the South Pole get lost and end up meeting Mr White polar bear in the North Pole! He shows them the way home but on the way visits America, England, Italy.

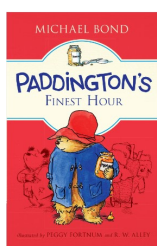
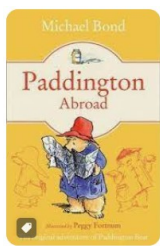


Mrs Blackley recommends...

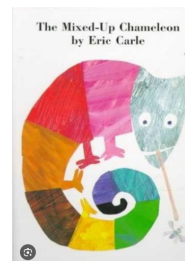


Mrs Chick's recommends...
