LITERACY

COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE

THE POWER OF TALK AND CONVERSATION

Using stories and circle time to listen to others and explain our ideas. Becoming more aware of a listener's needs and the serve and return nature of conversation

Beginning to use more complex sentences through our talk. Building up vocabulary that links to our experiences and use language to recreate roles in our play and narrate our ideas.

Develop understanding of questions.

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

Continuing to Develop gross motor skills and upper body strength and the coordination of large and small movements. To continue to work on fine motor skills hand strength and dexterity. Working towards triangular pencil grip and efficient scissor grip for control with writing and cutting. Handwriting skills.

Good hygiene - ongoing. To explore the importance of good diet and exercise for healthy bodies and lifestyels.

PERSONAL SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Develop confidence to try new things and to select resources with independence. Developing awareness of flexible thinking and applying to our own through processes. Taking on new challenges with growing independence and determination and growth mindset for exercising our brain as a muscle.

We will be extending our work on friendships to delve deeper into how our words and behavior impacts upon those around us. Embedding conscious community and school values into our everyday behavior and choices.

To listen and join in with stories and poems. Develop a love of reading and interest in books as sources of information/enjoyment. Answer and ask questions about what is read.

Applying phonics by developing skills of segmenting (for spelling CVC, CCVC words and words with double letters) and blending (for reading). To spot words within words and chunking technique to write longer words. Correct letter formation.

Applying phonics to write in sentences and longer pieces. To recognise some tricky words from sight and use in own writing.

ZHTAM

Consolidating numbers to 10 and beyond whilst expanding our awareness of numbers to 20 for counting. Understanding the value, order and meaning behind the digit. Where do we see these numbers in real life? How are they used? How are values represented in different ways? Correct number formation. Making equal groups and comparison.

Subitising number and partitioning into groups.

UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD

Understanding and celebrating the uniqueness of each other. Respecting difference. Traditional customs - Saint George's day.

Making observations of the changing seasons and features of our local environment, Landscape and features of the our beautiful Island.

Sharing news of family traditions and customs.

EXPRESSIVE ARTS AND DESIGN

Exploring-showing control when playing instruments and singing familiar songs writing and performing own verses for familiar songs.

Expressing our ideas through art, colour manipulation, different materials and construction. Artist focus: Matisse.

Use imaginative play to develop stories and narratives.
