We have had another fantastic week in the Curious Squirrel's room. The children have particularly loved the story We're Going On A Bear Hunt! We have shared some lovely story times together one on one and shared with our friends! Some of the children are amazing at completing some of the sentences in the story too when the grown-ups leave gaps in the story, some of our older children in the room are really beginning to demonstrate their early literacy skills. Following on from this interest, the children joined in with a super fun, sensory bear hunt themed activity which involved the children stepping into different trays filled with different items to represent each section of the bear hunt. For example, mud and water! This was so much fun and supported the children's development holistically. Later in the day the children enjoyed having a look through the bear hunt story box which was a big hit, especially the bear hat!

The children have also been enjoying the mark making and play dough this week, they have been developing and strengthening their fine motor skills with our freshly made play dough aided with rolling pins and cutters, and then using their super strong hands and fingers to create some fabulous artwork! Another activity we have enjoyed this week has been the sensory 2-piece animal puzzles, the children have enjoyed chatting about which animals they can spot and have been practicing the noises that they make too! 


