We have had a lovely autumnal week here in the Curious Squirrel's room! We have all been noticing the differences within nature, due to the seasonal change, and we have taken advantage of some wonderful, natural and autumnal activities this week!

The week started well as the children thoroughly enjoyed a sensory tray filled up with lots of crunchy, autumn leaves. The children enjoyed adding some small world animals to the tray of leaves and listening to the noises the leaves made as the animals would stomp over them. The children also enjoyed touching the leaves and exploring what they felt like, contributing to their physical and fine motor skills as well as their understanding of the world. The next day, the children had a fabulous time exploring and experimenting with a messy play, taste safe activity. The tray was filled with some different frozen vegetables and fruits, such as: carrots, peas and peaches. This activity was aided with some spoons to enable the children to try and scoop up the items, practicing their fine motor skills and their use of cutlery!

Throughout the middle of the week, lots of books and stories were enjoyed by all, a particular favourite this week has been the Peppa Pig counting book. Some of the children have demonstrated that they are able to recognise some of the numbers in the book and also did a brilliant job at practicing their counting skills!
