Throughout our very busy week the children have enjoyed collaborative learning opportunities such as making a bus together! Together, the children brought over chairs and encouraged other friends to come over and join in on their bus. This is a great way for children to improve their social skills, make new friendships as well as language enrichment through singing lovely songs - such as of course, the wheels on the bus!

The children enjoyed using their bus to go on lovely journeys such as Tapnell Farm and to the shops, which of course included them bringing back all their shopping! Helping the children to further their imagination skills through their play.

A great way to further children's language and development in several areas is through circle times and story times. The children had enjoyed reading one of our story books with a practitioner, the story was called 'Bumble Bear'. The children were able to understand that the words in the book tell the story - but they were able to tell us that they can make a story through what they can see in the pictures. Story times are SO important for children, it helps to ignite the fire in their imagination, where they are able to create their own images and engage their creativity. How amazing is that?







#### Curious Squirrel's Weekly Round Up!

The children in the Curious Squirrel's room have had a lovely time this week enjoying all sorts of activities indoors and outdoors! Role playing with the babies in the home corner has been a big hit this week with many of our children. They have shown real care and love for the baby dolls and have been rocking them to sleep in the wooden crib, in their arms and in the dolly buggies when in the garden. The children have also been pretending to feed the babies with pretend food items. One morning, one dolly had a feast which included several pretend cups of tea and every single item of fruit that we own! Participating in these lovely role play activities promotes the children's personal, social and emotional development as they learn to take care of the dolls. Role play benefits children's understanding of the world as they figure out the world around them by acting out scenarios, similar to those that they have seen and been a part of in their real life.

On Friday morning, before we headed over to have our school photos taken, we enjoyed having a pretend teddy bear's picnic. Together we worked hard to set up all our soft toys around a blanket, encouraging the development of our collaborative skills, we found the bears some yummy pretend food and shared the story book 'we're going on a bear hunt' – activities like this support several areas of the children's development, including; literacy, expressive arts and design, communication and language and personal, social and emotional development.

This week we planted our lovely new flowers that our administrator Bella found to go in our new planters! We worked together, using spades, to dig the soil out of the bag and pop it into the planters and fill them up. We then added in our beautiful new plants and the children were super excited to see the finished result! This activity encouraged the children to work together to complete a task, which promoted a sense of pride and belonging.
