




Asda are currently running their Cashpots for School scheme, whereby spending in store or online converts to a cash pot for school.

Curious Squirrel's Weekly Round Up!

It has been another week of fun here in the Curious Squirrel's room. It has flown by!

This week the children enjoyed participating in a magnetic fishing game. The fishing game is always well loved by the children and they usually will stay engaged with it for quite some time. On Friday, we used the game as an opportunity to focus on practicing and developing our patience and turn taking skills. Supported by the key practitioners in the room, the children were firstly encouraged to come and sit around a lovely, shiny, blue piece of material which we were using as the deep pond! The children were all very intrigued! We all then each had a turn to use the wooden fishing rod and attempt to catch a fish. Each fish has got a different colour and a different number on it. We shared some lovely conversations about the colour of each fish and some of the children were able to recognise some familiar numbers, 2 was the most well-known number! This experience also supported the development of the children's speech, language, communication and interaction skills. We discovered some new words to build on our vocabularly, for example 'shiny' and 'shimmery' when talking about the pond. The adults in the room also modelled simple, key phrases throughout the activity... Such as; 'my turn' and 'your turn' which further supports the children to continue to share positive interactions with their peers.

This week, come rain or sun, we have had some fantastic playing and exploring opportunities in our garden! The children have been loving using our seesaw recently and singing songs such as 'row your boat' and 'see saw margery daw' whilst rocking back and forth. Another outdoor favourite this week has been the water play! Particularly soapy and bubbly water which was used to bath the dollies!

Some other activities that we have enjoyed this week have been; exploring the indoor soft play, mark making with our fingers in the coloured sand and building amazing towers with the sensory blocks!

Wise owls weekly round up 7/10/24

What a busy week we have had in the wise owl's room this week!



Throughout our very busy week the children have enjoyed learning opportunities through there play based on a backdrop to learning of vehicles and transport as this seems to have been a super big interest throughout the room! This week the children have enjoyed making role play buses, cars, planes and pirate ships using the loose parts resources within the garden and in the room... This is a great way for children to improve their social skills, make new friendships, use their imagination, as well as language enrichment through singing lovely songs - such as of course, the wheels on the bus! Through the week the children have also enjoyed activities such as making passports and pane tickets using some brilliant mark making skills, practicing their letter and number writing using great fine motor skills and pen control, making car washes, using guttering making road tracks, rolling cars and different vehicles in paint and marking down how far they got- great for our mathematical skills! This then took a turn into foot printing which the children all had great fun doing!

A great way to further children's language and development in several areas is through circle times and story times. This week we have introduced the children to a circle time game of 'silly soup' where the children have to find the rhyming word cards and make them into a magical soup! This has been lots of fun and the children have really enjoyed learning which words rhyme and which don't and thinking of other silly rhyming words!

continuing our busy week, the children have begun our tooth brushing program! We have spoken with the children about the importance of tooth brushing and how we keep our teeth clean and healthy. We've had lots of fun playing with our dentist kit and children have been given the opportunity to join in tooth brushing at preschool. We know as parents we all have busy lives and we here at little explorers are always trying to find new ideas to help and support our parents and we feel tooth brushing is super beneficial to our children in helping promote self-care skills, independence and hygiene routines!

This week over at the hall, we have been focusing a lot on balance and gross motor movements. Following this, the children today have had a great go at using the bench balance beams and gymnastic beams to balance, climb and jump! The children all did a great job and showed some wonderful careful risk taking skills! The children enjoyed some time spent doing yoga, the children listened and watched carefully and followed instructions and stretched their bodies! The children have also been enjoying using bean bags and cones! Firstly, we used the bean bags for a balancing game to see if the children could balance beanbags on their heads whilst walking and then try to balance them on different parts of their body! we had such a fun time doing so! After this, the children then enjoyed a game of 'what's the colour Mr. wolf?' Where they had too listened to the colour shouted and then run to find the correct coloured cone. Well, what a super jam packed busy week we've had preschool, I can't wait to see what we get up too next week!
