OVERVIEW

After half term we will be continuing to explore friendships and revisiting our school values. This will also help us to broaden our understanding of our school values to exploring our roles in looking after our belongings, repairing, recycling which of course leads us to explore our roles in looking after our planet. Crafts and making things continue to be popular themes with the children so we will ensure plenty of opportunities for art and DT projects too. This half term also provides us with the lovely opportunity to explore Chinese New Year which will be a fabulous opportunity to make decorations and related art work whilst also celebrating the similarities and differences between traditions.

COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE

THE POWER OF TALK AND CONVERSATION.

Using stories and circle time to listen to others and explain our ideas.

Beginning to use more complex sentences through our talk. Building up vocabulary that links to our experiences and use language to recreate roles in our play.

Develop understanding of questions.

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

Continuing to Develop gross motor skills and upper body strength and the coordination of large and small movements. Building towards strong and accurate pencil grip (triangulation).

Good hygiene - ongoing. To explore the importance of good diet and exercise for healthy bodies and lifestyles.

PERSONAL, SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Develop confidence to try new things and to select resources with independence.

We will be extending our work on friendships to delve deeper into how our words and behavior impacts upon those around us and how to solve minor disagreements with growing independence.

Extending conversation to support relationships.

LITERACY

To listen and join in with stories and poems. Develop a love of reading and interest in books as sources of information/enjoyment. Answer and ask questions about what is read. Applying our growing bank of phonic sounds by developing skills of segmenting (for spelling CVC words) and blending (for reading). To recognise some tricky words from sight. Begin to understand features of sentences we see / read. To recognise the initial and end sounds in words.

UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD

Understanding and celebrating the uniqueness of each other. Respecting difference.

Making observations of the changing seasons and features of our local environment.

Sharing news of family traditions and customs.

MATHS

Investigating numbers to 10. Understanding the value, order and meaning behind the digit. Where do we see these numbers in real life? How are they used? How are values represented in different ways? Number composition.

Subitising number.

Exploring shapes around us.

EXPRESSIVE ARTS AND DESIGN

Exploring music, dance and instruments - linked to Chinese New Year.

Expressing our ideas through art, colour manipulation, different materials and construction.

Use imaginative play to develop stories and narratives.
