Early Years Newsletter

News Focus: Reading -Links to learning and later life.

- Early literacy development gives children lifelong benefits. Stories, rhymes and songs help with children's language and vocabulary development. They also develop children's emotional understanding. Early literacy is linked to better academic achievement, mental well-being and empathy.
- Babies and young children love sharing books with adults: it is an intimate and pleasurable activity that can help with their social and emotional development.[\[footnote 1\]](#) As they share books, babies and young children enjoy rhythms and rhymes and hear rich vocabulary and language. For older children in the EYFS, shared reading is a powerful context for conversation. When adults use a book as the focus for conversation, it helps children to learn new vocabulary and more complex forms of language. Children in early years settings relish both traditional and new stories, rhymes and songs. They benefit in the long term from the vocabulary and language that they learn.
- Shared reading at home, together with activities like visiting the library, is associated with better achievement throughout schooling, regardless of family income.
