To build our vocabulary and apply new words during own talk.

Express ideas in sentences of at least 4-6 words, using correct tense. Begin to use 'because' 'and' 'or' to lengthen and join ideas.

To build listening skills – being able to listen for longer periods of time or shift focus / attention between tasks.

Ask and answer simple questions.

To continue to build a growing repertoire of phonic sounds – building fluency for blending.

Using phonics to spell simple CVC words.

Begin to add labels to pictures they have drawn.

To read a growing bank of tricky words.

To continue to use funky fingers to build hand dexterity and finger strength, leading to accurate letter formation.

To retell stories with good sequence and growing vocab.
